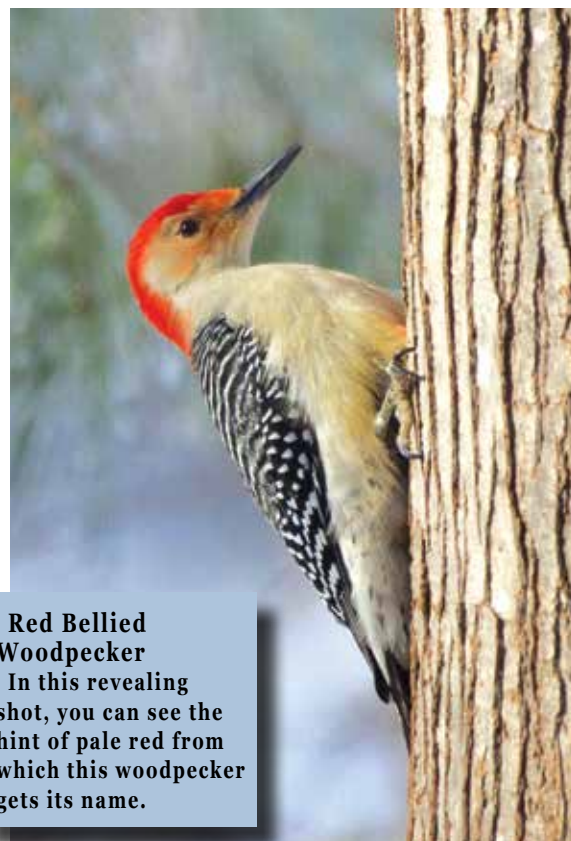
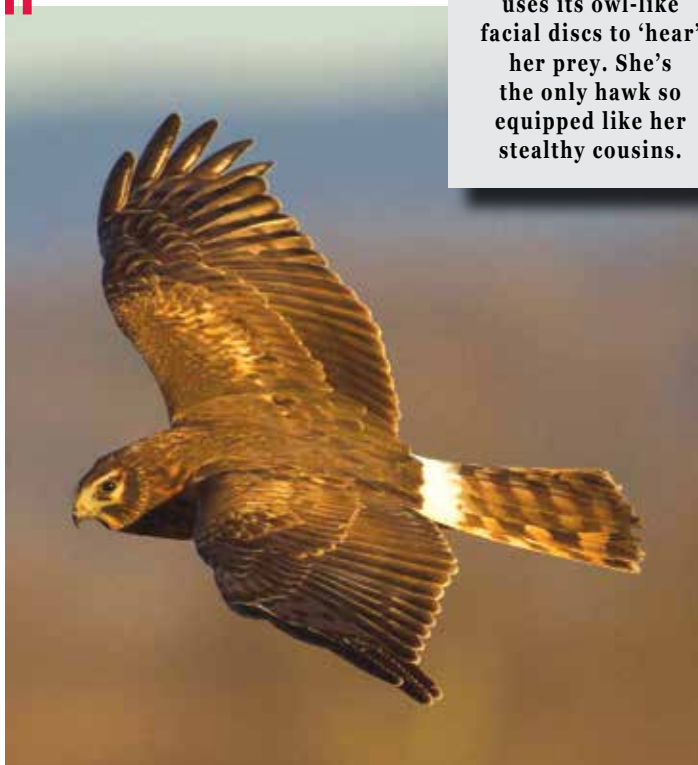


BIRDS
