Our friends Tony Lucarro and Peter Meyer joined in the fun with their 27 Signature...and we made HISTORY. We enjoyed a 10 year run producing a generation of world class boat races with our Gateway Powerboat Regatta/National Powerboat Association Series...Pete Aitkin, Chris and Mark Lavin, John and JD D'Elia, Stu Hayim, are all products of our events... just to name a few.

Guy may best be described by these words from his nephew, Pat Fay:



"Guy was the most generous and fun person to be around if you were family and if you were his friend, you were family whether you wanted to be or not. He would always have a crowd




