Also, make sure all of your cables are free and working properly and make sure your ski is running well BEFORE you put it in the water so you can enjoy your ride without wondering if your ski will konk out on you. One more thing, make sure you get out on the water and ride because one of the worst things you can do to your jet-ski or your boat is to let it sit.

And you know unfortunately so many people don't create the time to get out on the water and what I've found is even though so many people live very active lives, if they plan some time each week to get on the water, the rest of their life just seems happier and they ending using their ski instead of letting it sit.
